Meet Allosaurus Fragilis — a fierce predator of the Jurassic world! Think of a big, scary lizard with sharp teeth and claws, fast, strong, and ready to catch its prey.

Allosaurus lived during the late Jurassic Period (~150 million years ago) in western North America. Its name means "different lizard", and it had a big skull, short arms with three clawed fingers, and a long, heavy tail to balance its body.

Length: ~8.5 metres (28 ft)

• Weight: ~2.3 tons

• Fun fact: Its saw-edged teeth made it a deadly hunter, and it may have even hunted Stegosaurus!

Brachiosaurus 🐥





Meet Brachiosaurus — the dinosaur with a neck so long it could touch the sky! Imagine a gentle giant towering above the trees, munching on the juiciest leaves way up high. It's like the skyscraper of the dinosaur world!

Brachiosaurus was one of the biggest dinosaurs ever, using its super-long neck to reach leaves that no one else could. It lived in North America, and the first fossils were discovered along the Colorado River in 1900.

Type: Sauropod

Length: ~26 metres (85 ft)

Weight: 30–45 tons

Diet: Plant eater, munching 200–400 kg of leaves per day!

• Fun fact: There's even an asteroid named after Brachiosaurus!



Diplodocus 🗼

Meet **Diplodocus** — a **super long, long-necked dinosaur**, like a giant lizard with an **extra-long neck and tail!** Walking on **all fours**, Diplodocus was a **peaceful plant-eater**, slowly strolling through the forests, munching on leaves all day.

Its name means "double beam" because of the strange bones in its tail. It lived in what's now western North America, about 150 million years ago, and could grow up to 35 metres (115 ft) long and weigh 10–15 tons!

Tail vertebrae: ~80

Diet: Plants

• Fun fact: Scientists have found **lots of Diplodocus fossils**, making it one of the best-studied dinosaurs.

Pterodactyl 🦽

Imagine a dinosaur that could **fly through the skies** — that's a **Pterodactyl!** Not technically a dinosaur, but a **flying reptile**, it had a **long beak, leathery wings like a bat**, and soared above lakes and forests like a superhero.

It swooped down to catch **fish or bugs** with its sharp teeth, exploring the skies of the ancient world.

• **Type:** Flying reptile

• **Diet:** Fish and small animals

• Fun fact: Think of it as a prehistoric ninja of the skies!

Stegosaurus 🚺 🔛





Meet the **Stegosaurus** — a dinosaur that looked like a **walking tank!** Its **row of giant** plates ran along its back like armour, and its spiky tail was ready to defend it from predators.

Stegosaurus lived during the late Jurassic Period (~150 million years ago) in North America and Portugal. It could grow up to 9 metres (30 ft) long, 4 metres (14 ft) tall, and weigh nearly 5 tons — but its brain was only about the size of a dog's!

• **Plates:** 17, growing from its skin

• Tail spikes: 60–90 cm (2–3 ft)

• **Diet:** Plants 🖖

• Fun fact: It could only move around 7 km/h (5 mph) — slow, but armoured and mighty!

Triceratops 😕 🔛





Meet the Triceratops — the three-horned tank of the dinosaur world! With three big horns on its face and a frill around its neck, it looked fierce but was actually a gentle giant, munching on leaves and bushes.

It lived during the late Cretaceous Period (~65 million years ago) in North America, defending itself from predators like **Tyrannosaurus Rex**.

Length: ~8 metres (26 ft)

Height: ~3 metres (10 ft)

Weight: 6–12 tons

• Teeth: 400–800, constantly replaced

• Fun fact: Its skull alone could be over 2 metres (7 ft) long, and it even appeared as a Transformer called Slag!

Tyrannosaurus Rex 👑

Meet T-Rex — the king of the dinosaurs! Huge, scary, and ultimate adventure-ready, it had massive teeth, tiny but powerful arms, and a tail to balance its giant head.

T-Rex lived in western North America during the late Cretaceous Period (~66 million years ago). It could grow up to 13 metres (42 ft) long, 4 metres (13 ft) tall at the hip, and weigh 7 tons.

- Skull: 1.5 metres (5 ft)
- Speed: Up to ~40 km/h (25 mph)
- Fun fact: Scientists debate if it was a hunter or scavenger, but one thing's for sure — T-Rex was legendary!

Velociraptor 🔸 🦖





Meet the Velociraptor — the ninja of the dinosaur world! Small, fast, and super **clever**, it hunted in packs and outsmarted dinosaurs much bigger than itself.

Velociraptors lived during the late Cretaceous Period (~73 million years ago) in Mongolia. They were about the size of a turkey, had feathers, sharp claws, and were lightning-fast.

- **Length:** ~2 metres (6.6 ft)
- Height: 0.5 metres (1.6 ft)
- **Weight:** 15 kg (33 lbs)
- Diet: Small animals
- Fun fact: One of the most famous fossils shows a Velociraptor locked in battle with a Protoceratops!
