



Tyrannosaurus Rex – The King of Dinosaurs 👑 🦖

- 🦷 Huge sharp teeth – largest carnivorous teeth ever (30 cm / 1 ft long)
- 🦶 Walked on two legs with a long tail for balance
- 📏 Up to 13 m (42 ft) long, 4 m (13 ft) tall, weighed up to 7 tons
- 🐾 Tiny but strong arms with two clawed fingers
- ⚡ Could run up to 40 km/h (25 mph)
- 🌍 Lived in western North America ~66 million years ago
- 👁 Forward-facing eyes for depth perception
- 😬 Fierce, legendary, and totally awesome dinosaur king!




Allosaurus – The Jurassic Hunter 🦖 🔥

- 🦷 Sharp teeth & strong claws for hunting
- ⚡ Fast, muscular predator
- 🌍 Lived ~150 million years ago, late Jurassic, western North America
- ✨ Name means “different lizard”
- 🦶 Walked on two legs with long tail & short arms
- 📏 Size: 8.5 m (28 ft) long, 2.3 tons – as heavy as a small car!
- 🦖 Could take on tough dinosaurs like Stegosaurus
- 🗡️ Fierce hunter with saw-edged teeth & speed



Brachiosaurus – The Sky-High Dinosaur 🦖 🌳

- 🌳 Super long neck – could reach leaves high in the trees
- 🐘 Gentle giant – one of the biggest dinosaurs
- 📏 Up to 26 m (85 ft) long, weighed 30–45 tons (6 elephants!)
- 🦴 Sauropod – relatives include Diplodocus & Apatosaurus
- 🖐️ Name means “arm lizard” (front legs longer than back legs)
- 🦶 Walked on four legs, small head, shorter tail
- 🌿 Ate 200–400 kg (440–880 lbs) of plants daily
- 🌌 Fun fact: asteroid named Brachiosaurus!



Diplodocus – The Long, Gentle Giant 🦖 🌿

- 🌿 Peaceful plant-eater
- 🦴 Lived ~150 million years ago, western North America
- 📏 Up to 35 m (115 ft) long, 10–15 tons (small herd of elephants!)
- 🦶 Walked on four legs with extra-long neck & tail
- ✨ Name means “double beam” – tail bones unique
- 🗺️ Tail had ~80 vertebrae – long & flexible
- 🎬 Famous in films, toys, & museums
- 🤪 Super long, leaf-munching, tail-swinging gentle giant



Small Triceratops – The Three-Horned Hero 🦖 🌿

- 🌱 Gentle plant-eater – leaves & bushes
- 🟦 Horned face & bony frill as natural shield
- 🐾 Roamed in groups for safety
- ✨ Name means “three-horned face” (tri + keratops)
- 🏞️ Fossils first discovered 1887 near Denver, Colorado
- 🎬 Appears in movies, toys, Transformers (Autobot Slag!)



Large Triceratops – The Giant Horned Dinosaur 🦖 🌿

- 🌱 Gentle plant-eater – ate lots of leaves & bushes
- 🛡️ Three big horns & huge frill for defence
- 🐘 Fully grown: 8 m (26 ft) long, 3 m (10 ft) tall, 6–12 tons
- 🦴 Skull over 2 m (7 ft) long, 400–800 teeth
- 🐾 Travelled in herds for protection
- ⚡ Fossils first discovered 1887 near Denver, Colorado
- 📺 Famous in movies, toys, Transformers (Autobot Slag!)



Small Stegosaurus – The Spiky Little Plant-Eater 🦖 🌿

- 🌱 Gentle plant-eater – ferns & leaves
- 🟡 Two rows of bony plates & spiky tail for protection
- ✨ Name means “roof lizard”
- 🐾 Wandered in herds for safety
- 🏞️ Fossils first discovered late 19th century
- 🎬 Inspired movies, toys, & books



Large Stegosaurus – The Giant Spiky Wonder 🦖 🌿

- 🌱 Plant-eater – ferns, cycads, leafy snacks
- 🛡️ Massive bony plates & spiky tail (thagomizer) for defence
- ⚡ Tail could swing; plates may have regulated temperature or been used to show off
- 📏 Size: 9 m (30 ft) long, 4 m (13 ft) tall
- 🐢 Slow-moving but well-protected
- 🗺️ Fossils first discovered late 1800s, North America
- 🎬 Appears in films, toys, museums, books – true Jurassic hero!



Velociraptor – The Ninja Dinosaur 🦖 🧠

- ⚡ Fast, clever, small – size of a turkey
- 🐾 Hunted in packs, outsmarted bigger dinosaurs
- 🍃 Likely feathered for agility
- ✨ Name means “swift seizer”
- 🌍 Lived ~73 million years ago, late Cretaceous
- 🐾 Fully grown: 2 m (6.6 ft) long, 0.5 m (1.6 ft) tall, 15 kg (33 lbs)
- 🗡 Sickle-shaped claws on feet for catching prey
- 🎬 Movies made them look huge, but real Velociraptors were small & smart
